

## Opening a Chapter Bank Account

Chapter funds should not be kept in a personal account. The WVU Alumni Association strongly encourages groups to establish a policy for handling chapter funds and accounting procedures. Having a local bank account allows groups to operate financially independent from the WVU Alumni Association. Before you can open you a chapter bank account, you will need an EIN number. If your organization already has an EIN number, you can proceed to the **Opening a Bank Account** heading. Rules and requirements may vary by state and financial institution.

## Applying for an EIN Number

- 1. Apply for an EIN number for your chapter at <a href="https://sa.www4.irs.gov/modiein/individual/index.jsp">https://sa.www4.irs.gov/modiein/individual/index.jsp</a>. This will allow you to set up the bank account in your chapter name instead of under your personal information.
- 2. Once on the website, click **Begin Application**
- 3. Then click: View Additional Types, Including Tax-Exempt and Governmental Organizations
- 4. Then select: **Community/Volunteer Group**. A community or volunteer group is any specialized interest group that comes together to provide volunteer services. These groups generally apply for EINs for banking purposes only.
- 5. Complete the basic information requested. Once completed, you should automatically be assigned your EIN.

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- 1. Take your chapter's EIN number to a local bank to open an account.
  - a. Your bank may require a letter of good standing from the WVU Alumni Association. If such letter is requested, email the Director of Engagement, Meridith Balas at <a href="Meridith.Balas@mail.wvu.edu">Meridith.Balas@mail.wvu.edu</a>.
  - b. You may need at least two signers on the account.
- 2. The EIN number and bank account information should be sent to your staff liaison at the WVU Alumni Association immediately for auditing purposes.

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
